TREASURER'S REPORT: ANDREA BLANCHARD

We would like to combine our Parent Appreciation event with Play Day next school year.

Staffing: We are excited to announce three new additions to the SRE team: Allison Barton (LAT), Miranda Deleurme will be teaching in the primary grades, and Alyssa Bergen who is taking over for Ms.Miles Grade 5 class.

2018-19 Registration: Registration is now open for next year. Families register online and stop by the office with required documents. Our current enrolment is projected at 178 which is a few more than last year. We haven't capped any class sizes yet, we are welcoming students from other schools wait lists.

Dress Code: Our dress code will be evolving next year in an effort to stay current and updated as per School District 23 policies.

School Photos: We need to commit to school photos and dates for next year. If the PAC is interested in looking at options I can assist. If we want to change companies, open to suggestions, also need to set dates for next year. If we do want to change companies, we need to decide in the next week. Shasta S. said she would look into it.
