Order through SRE personal website, easy recordkeeping, shipping \$5 or 4%. <u>Dillman</u> 40-50% profit, 50 products under \$10. <u>Norcard</u> has kids bring order forms back to school and orders come through school to be distributed. Pay .50 cents per brochure.

Magazines: QSP-gift portion, up to 85% off cover price, 37% profit, incentive prizes, 12-16wks for first delivery. CCRP, local company, up to 70% off cover price. 500+ magazines. Approx \$10/order profit? Dave Johnson's feedback from previous school was they had many complaints with CCRP with orders not coming in until people called and harassed. PAC decided against hassle with Magazine fundraising.
